NOVEMBER 2023

1st / 2nd Give thanks that we have been successful in applying for a Wales Africa Government Grant that will help fund the APT project during 2024. Since the project began over 200 devices have been made for children with disabilities. We thank God for everyone who has worked on the project and for all the donations of materials that we've received. Pray that the project would continue to thrive next year and benefit more children.

3rd / 4th Pray for the spiritual needs of the families we serve. Pray that God would equip us to be faithful witnesses in all we do and say. Pray that we would see families united in Christ and lives transformed by the gospel.

5th / 6th The holiday club starts on the 7th of this month and will run for 4 weeks. Pray that the club will be a success and the children would listen well to the lessons. We pray that the holy spirit would give them understanding and a desire to know more about Jesus. Pray for the staff and volunteers leading the club.

7th / 8th Pray for a single mum and her young daughter who are both painfully thin and malnourished. The daughter has cerebral palsy but mum is unable to afford the therapy she needs. Mum also has underlying health problems. Pray that we will be able to assist the family in getting the medical help they need and work with Mum on a long term plan to increase her income. Pray that God would give the mum strength and healing so she is able to care for her daughter well.

9th / 10th Sadly, it is common for children with disabilities to be left alone all day while the parents go to work. Sometimes young siblings are kept home from school to care for them but as soon as the parents go out the door, they lock the child inside and go out to wander the streets. This obviously has an impact on their education and risks them turning to street life permanently. As a result of being neglected in this way and not being fed, we are seeing disabled children suffering from severe malnutrition and severe deformities caused by being left in poor postural positions all day. Pray God would open up ways that would make it possible for these children to be well cared for during the day and that families, friends and communities would do more to support these parents. Pray that there would be an end to the suffering of these children.

11th / 12th Give thanks for the freedom we have to share the gospel with the communities of Njoro. Pray for our weekly bible study and the Sunday service, that the message of the gospel would come across clearly and we would see a spiritual awakening in the hearts of those who attend.

13th / 14th The most challenging area of our work is engaging the husbands and fathers of the families we work with. Pray God will give us more opportunities to come alongside the men and would guide us by His spirit as we share the gospel with them.

15th / 16th We thank God for the partnerships we have formed with organisations, schools and government departments that have helped impact the families we serve in a positive way. Pray that as we grow as an organisation there would be a strengthening of these partnerships that would further the work and bring glory to God.

17th/18th Give thanks to God for everyone who has donated items, time and funds that have helped sustain the organisation. Pray that it would please God to continue to provide for the work and we would use all His gifts to bring glory to His name.

19th/20th Beatrice continues to have a few health issues. Pray that God would bring her healing and give her strength for each day. Give thanks that the addition of new staff is helping to reduce her workload.

21st/22nd Jossey and Evans continue to run the Saturday Club for boys needing emotional support and at risk of engaging in street life. Each week they make items with APT, play games, have a meal and have a short bible study. We thank God for the positive change in their behaviour and their keenness to learn more about God. Pray that God would grant them understanding of what they are being taught and they would come to know the joy of salvation for themselves.

23rd/24th Pray for a dad that has an addiction to alcohol. Although he has a steady job at a local sawmill, his addiction means he doesn't support his family financially. Pray that as we begin our walk with this family, the dad will experience the love, mercy, and kindness of God and turn away from alcohol.

25th/26th Pray for a young boy who has been having suicidal thoughts. Pray that through the support we give, God would reveal Himself to him and be gracious to help him know a father's love.

27th/28th As costs of everyday items and fuel in Kenya continue to rise and impact our budget, pray that God would provide us with the financial support we need to continue the work of the organisation.

29th/30th We give thanks for the Disability Support Groups that we are able to facilitate. Last month we were able to assist 5 members with processing birth certificates and we thank God that several members are interested to start a basic business skills course which will lead them to starting small businesses. Pray that our support and the education we give will make a lasting difference to their lives.
